Dear Members and Friends of St. Mary's,

Christmas is God's wonderful good gift to us as he gives his son into our world to make it his world again. I've been wondering how we can "give Christmas" to those around us, not just in December but throughout the year. Many people are conscious of the way Christmas has become commercialized, or has been sanitized to "Happy Holidays". We are the ones who are privileged to know and love what this festival is all about.

The Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary and The Presentation of Christ in the Temple

Dwight Thomas,
Organist

Dwight Thomas received the Bachelor of Music degree from Butler University, Indianapolis, studying piano with Dorothy Munger and piano pedagogy with Steve Roberson, and

the Master of Music degree from Indiana University, Bloomington, studying organ and church music with Marilyn Keiser and Robert Rayfield. Before moving to Florida in 1999, he served at several Indianapolis ecclesiastical institutions, and served as an organ faculty member / resident organist at both Christian Theological Seminary and Butler University.

In addition to being a classically trained organist, Dwight also is an established theater organist and was named "Theater Organist of the Year" by the American Theater Organ Society in 2006. He was staff organist,

playing the famous Wurlitzer organ at the Roaring 20's restaurant in Ellenton, Florida until its closure in 2010.

As a concert organist, he has performed recitals in both the classical and theater genres in the United States and Great Britain, including the instruments housed at York Minister and Westminster Abbey and has appeared locally with The Florida Orchestra and Sarasota Orchestra.

He has been involved in several recording projects which feature him, including The All-American Music of Irving Berlin; that audio being selected as one of the top 10 best recordings of 1990 by TIME magazine.

Dwight also joins the illustrious company of Robert Schumann, Glenn Gould and Leon Fleischer; all keyboard musicians who have been afflicted with focal dystonia of the right hand, a neurological condition for which there is no cure. While focal dystonia has ended the careers of many musicians, Dwight considers himself one of the lucky ones with symptoms that have vastly disappeared since its onset in 2003.

He currently serves as Director of Music and Organist at the Cathedral Church of Saint Peter (Episcopal), in St. Petersburg, Florida as well as Chapel Organist at Westminster Shores Retirement Community and is current Dean of the St. Petersburg Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.

Confirmation and Reception

Confirmation is a sacrament, that is a means of grace, in which we reaffirm our Christian commitment to live for God in Jesus Christ and receive God's strengthening grace and to help us to that through the laying on of hands with prayer by the Bishop. (See page 860 in the Book of Common Prayer) It is a very important step to take in our Christian lives and we approach it with careful study and prayer.

Those coming from the Roman Catholic Church are typically "received" rather than confirmed because they have already been confirmed in the same sense as we mean. Sometimes people who have been away from the church and have now returned welcome the opportunity to renew their commitment and receive formal prayer for this rededication. We provide for this as well, with the same sort of preparation.

Ten of our members are preparing to take this important step on Sunday, March 19 next year. Please keep them in your prayers and support them with your presence that day. If you would like to join them in this exciting journey of faith, please contact Fr. Rowe. Preparation begins on Tuesday, January 10.

Here is the Confirmation Prayer from the Book of Common Prayer page 418. It is a wonderful prayer to review and pray for ourselves and for others.

Defend, O Lord, your servant *N.* with your heavenly grace, that (s)he may continue yours for ever, and daily increase in your Holy Spirit more and more, until (s)he comes to your everlasting kingdom. Amen.
