St. Bartholomew - August 23, identified by some scholars as Nathaniel, the man of Cana in Galilee who was summoned to Jesus by Philip, St. Bartholomew identified Jesus as the "Son of God" after Jesus identified him as the one he saw under the fig tree (John 1:47-50). Jesus appeared to him on the shore of the Sea of Tiberius, the third appearance of Jesus to the disciples after the Resurrection, and Jesus ate with them.
