



From the Desk of Fr. Bill

My Brothers and Sisters in the St. Mary's family,

In my new position as your Priest-in-Charge, I greet you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

I trust all of you were able to watch Fr. Rowe's final service. It was absolutely wonderful. It was hard for me to hold back my tears as he delivered his final words of counsel to us. When he celebrated the eucharist, I sensed again that the glory of the Lord had filled the temple, God's presence was so real. St. Mary's has indeed been blessed by his ministry. I know all of you wished that you could have been present to tell him good-bye, but don't worry you will have an opportunity to do that. When it becomes safe for us to gather as a whole community, hopefully sometime later this year, we will bring Fr. Michael and Diane back to celebrate their ministry among us.

Now, the time has arrived for us to look to the future. Transitions are always a time of uncertainty. In the climate in which we find ourselves today, the anxiety can only be heightened. Like me, you maybe feel a little bit like Peter. Remember when he stepped out of the boat and began to walk toward Jesus and looked down? But like Peter, as long as we keep our eyes on Jesus, we will be just fine.

We have an outstanding Vestry who have been working quietly behind the scenes since Fr. Rowe announced his retirement at the end of January. They have set in place a number of committees that will now go into operation to assure a smooth and efficient search process. In an article that follows, the Chair of the Rector Search Committee, Chris Davies, spells out the search process in greater detail.

Throughout the summer months we will continue to hold all of our scheduled weekday eucharists and morning and evening prayers which you are welcome to attend. For the immediate future we will continue to restrict our weekend Eucharists to the 10 a.m. Sunday morning service which you can watch in your own homes. When the Bishop,



Vestry and I determine that it is safe to assemble, we will open the 10 a.m. service to parishioners and resume the 8 a.m. Sunday and 5 p.m. Saturday services. Social distancing by each family will of course be maintained. We trust, that at least through the summer months, this can be accomplished while yet allowing everyone to attend the service of their choice. Masks will become part of our apparel. Streaming the 10 a.m. service will continue so that persons with underlying health concerns will be able to participate from home and partake of “spiritual communion.”

I am grateful to the Vestry for hiring Mother Gail Tomei to assist me in ministry four days each week. During the summer months (June-October) when ministry commitments in Pennsylvania take her north, she has also agreed to continue to meet with the Order of St. Luke and the Pastoral Care Team each week through Zoom to coordinate their activities and lead their study groups.

During the summer I hope to meet with each of the Vestry members and each of the team leaders under their area of responsibility to make sure that every aspect of our church life has adapted to operating to its greatest efficiency that is socially responsible in this challenging climate.

Finally, I ask all of you to continue in the telephone buddy system that Jill Smith created until the pandemic is over.

God bless each of you. Continue to pray for your Vestry and clergy. With God’s help we will come through this period of transition just fine!

Rector Search Update

I am honored to have been asked by the Vestry of St. Mary's Episcopal Church to be the Chair of the Rector Search Committee. With this honor comes a great responsibility to ensure the search process proceeds in a deliberate manner to select three well qualified candidates to recommend to the Vestry.

The Search Committee and Process are described below and include information on how to apply to be a member of the search committee.

St. Mary's Rector Search Committee and Process

Thank you for your interest in the St. Mary's Episcopal Church Rector Search process. The following are some details regarding the search process and an application for anyone interested in being considered to be on the Search Committee.

Formation of the Search Committee

The Search Committee is a creation of the Vestry and works for and on behalf of the Vestry. The Vestry selects the Chair and works with the Chair to determine the remaining members. It is important to keep in mind that in accordance with the Canons of the Church, it is the task of the Vestry to issue a call to the preferred candidate, and then only with the prior approval of the Bishop.

Composition of the Search Committee

The Search Committee should include a diverse group (differences in age, gender, background, length of membership, groups, skills, etc.) who are equipped for the responsibility of assessing the knowledge, ability and skills of the Rector candidates. Providing a balanced Search Committee is crucial to the search process. The Search Committee will have 7-9 members. All applicants for the Committee will be given prayerful consideration.

The Chair will select one of the other members to serve as Committee Chaplain. The Chaplain will open and close meetings in prayer and seek to maintain a spiritual focus on the part of the Search Committee while performing its functions. The Chaplain will vote and discuss at meetings similar to other Search Committee members.

The Chair will work closely with the Canon of the Ordinary, Richard Norman, and the Senior Warden, Paul Judkins, keeping them both informed of progress by the Committee.

Expectations of Selected Search Committee Members

Here are some necessary characteristics for all Search Committee members:

- Communicant in good standing (attends church regularly, giver of record, gives of time and talent).
- Good organizational and communication skills (checks and responds to emails and phone calls quickly).
- Willing to commit time necessary to engage in the Search Committee's work.
- Agrees to maintain confidentiality and secure all search correspondence in confidential files that will be erased/shredded at the end of the Search Committee's work.
- Comfortable with the work of assessment.
- Team player willing to work for the good of the whole church.
- Spiritually sound person of prayer.
- Is regularly involved in and familiar with various church activities.
- Can make decisions about candidates without discrimination based on race, color, sex (gender, gender identity or sexual orientation), pregnancy, national origin, age, handicap or marital status.
- Understands the scope of the position of Rector at St. Mary's.

Requirements of Search Committee Members

- Members must commit to attending regular meetings, to follow through on tasks in a timely manner, and to serve for the full duration of the search process. The Search Committee will meet frequently (via Zoom or telephone during the Coronavirus Pandemic), possibly twice per week at times, probably weekly or bi-weekly on most weeks.
- Review all application materials of candidates approved by the Bishop and assess the candidates.
- Communicate clearly and warmly with candidates.
- Perform personal reference checks as directed.
- Review social media of the Rector and his or her parish as directed.
- Conduct virtual interviews of candidates.
- Begin initial assessments and narrowing the candidate pool as a group.
- A collaborative spirit and the desire to work with others as a team.
- Good at listening to others and considering opinions and agendas that differ from one's own.
- An ability to maintain confidentiality (including from one's spouse or domestic partner) about the details of the search and assessment.
- After required Diocesan clearance, be willing to visit candidates in their parishes.
- Present names of three (3) finalists to the Vestry to interview.

Termination of the Search Committee

The Search Committee essentially terminates upon presentation of the three finalists to the Vestry.

1. How long you have been attending St. Mary's?

4. Why do you want to serve on the Search Committee?
5. Describe special skills and qualifications you have acquired from employment, previous volunteer work, or through other activities that you feel you can offer to our search process.
6. How does your worship experience at St. Mary's inform your perspective as a potential Search Committee member?
7. What else would you like to share about yourself?

Treasurer's Update

Like many organizations, St. Mary's is experiencing challenges from the COVID-19 pandemic. Our biggest financial challenge is the significant decline we have seen in parish support during the first four months of this year compared both to our budget and to what we saw last year. Our parish support revenue is down by about 20% by either measure. Over 90% of our budgeted income is from parish support, so it will be difficult to manage a shortfall of this magnitude if it continues. Please keep current on your pledge if you are able, and if you have not pledged consider doing so, or just give as you can. It is easy to give on-line via the parish website. Or you can mail a check to the church office. Your support is needed and much appreciated.

We are working to live within our budget, and to reduce expenses where we can do so smartly. We want to maintain our staffing and their salaries and benefits, as the staff are central to fulfilling our mission and serving the parish. In this context, we have applied for an SBA loan under the CARES Act (as have most of the churches in the Episcopal Diocese of Southwest Florida) and it looks promising that we will receive about \$61,000 through this program. We plan to spend these funds in such a way that the full amount of the loan will be forgiven, which includes the requirement of spending at least 75% of the funds on payroll, so this loan (then grant) will help us maintain our staffing even if parish support doesn't recover. And if parish support does recover (which we hope it will) then we will be in a better position to pay for long-term maintenance work that the church requires.

I will be taking a summer intensive on Anglican Theologians in June and July. If the "stay at home" restrictions are lifted, I hope to find some work at the seminary this summer, as the stage-hand work I had been doing has been affected by health restrictions. We had planned to have a church wedding in Cristina's home town in Spain this August, but those plans are on hold due to the pandemic.

I am really looking forward to the coming year of seminary here in Berkeley. It is my final year; I hope to be ordained as a deacon in the coming winter of 2020 and as a priest in summer of 2021. There is a great need for community and God's love in the world right now and the Episcopal Church is in a great place to share in that.

It is hard to believe that two years has passed so quickly and that so much change has occurred. In reflecting on what we are experiencing, I looked into Episcopal Church history to see how we responded to the Spanish Flu of 1918. There is a rich history of the church adapting and continuing to serve the marginalized in many communities across this country. Our ancestors have faced great adversities and we find this in scripture and modern history. Our world will face today's adversities and we will overcome this current struggle together.

As Jesus recently reminded us in the Gospel, *"Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes in me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will he do, because I go to the father."*

Pastoral Care



Outreach News

The Outreach Commission has been responding to the needs of our outreach partners during the COVID-19 crisis. Our focus has been on providing much needed food for the families we support. Here are some highlights of our activities.

Harvest Time

The final food distribution that should have taken place on March 28th had to end abruptly when the COVID-19 rules came out. To address the critical needs of the two migrant communities we support, the Outreach Commission in partnership with the ECW, allocated funds to provide Publix gift cards for the families. Sandy York, the ECW Representative, was instrumental in personally raising funds through her friends and neighbors to help with our efforts. Thirty-eight families received the gift cards. The gift cards were based on family size and ranged from \$50 to \$125. The distribution took place in early May.

Kindness for Kids

In the past, as part of the Kindness for Kids program, each year an "Undie Sunday" was held in August or September. The purpose was to collect underwear and socks for the

children who receive the Christmas gifts we provide. The Outreach Commission voted to suspend this collection and instead hold a food drive in early Fall. We will be partnering with the St. Mary's Men's Group to collect much needed food for the Café of Life, one of our outreach partners.

New Horizons

New Horizons (NH) has responded in many ways to the crisis caused by the pandemic on the nearly 800 children in its programs. Acting quickly, it worked with Lee and Collier counties to provide 2 meals per day delivered to each child by its own NH staff members. Working in tandem, St. Mary's Outreach Commission provided each family, for our nearly 40 children, with a personal Publix food gift card. The cards were based on family size and ranged from \$50 to \$125. The county student food programs end in June and St. Mary's intends to provide additional family assistance this summer if unemployment issues continue.

As New Horizons tries to launch a safe plan for its traditional summer reading program, St. Mary's remains ready to offer its Parish Life Center for safe student activities, whether it is for small groups or for a location from which to establish distance learning.

We pray that **Super Kids Club** will restart at the end of August and that we will again have our volunteers to tutor and mentor these K - 5th graders who need our help and encouragement.

Funding Sources

The Church recently filed a registration with **Publix Community Charities** so that it can appeal to their Foundation for help with our food distribution programs. With Vestry's endorsement, St. Mary's also intends to write a grant to the Diocese of SWFL to help with the increasing costs of food assistance programs, if this source of funding is again available in the Fall.

Penny Wise Thrift Shop

As many of you know the **Penny Wise Thrift Shop** has been supporting St. Mary's for almost 30 years. This year has probably been one of the most challenging. We began the winter months very successfully with revenue slightly exceeding that of last year. We received many high-quality donations of clothing, housewares and furniture; in fact our warehouse is now full because furniture donations have been brisk.

All of this came to a halt in early March when we had to close down operations in order to protect staff and customers from the COVID-19 virus. We have posted signs indicating that we cannot receive donations at this time as well. During the shut-down we have done some minor repairs, a lot of cleaning in the kitchen area and some rearranging of our displays to optimize use of our space.

We are carefully watching the national and local reports to understand the status of the virus here in our area. As the governor will start opening non-essential businesses in May, we are discussing the possibility of reopening Penny Wise in June. When we reopen we hope to be able to staff the store from 10AM-2PM (our summer hours) but will have to be flexible depending on the numbers of volunteers. We WELCOME additional volunteers - it really is rewarding to work in the store. We are discussing the procedures

we will be putting into place to protect both our customers and our staff. We will distribute notices to our customers and St Mary's parishioners when we have a definite reopening date. We are REALLY looking forward to getting back to business!!!



The Feast of Pentecost

The Feast of Pentecost on May 31st is one of the three great celebrations of the church year, along with Christmas and Easter. It celebrates the pouring out of the Holy Spirit that Jesus promised, creating the Church. Let us pray that we may “daily increase in the Holy Spirit more and more”. To mark the importance of this day, we use incense during the Eucharist. The Paschal Candle, which burns throughout the Easter Season, will be extinguished at the end of services on May 31st. Throughout the rest of the year, the Paschal Candle is used at baptisms and funerals as a sign of Christ’s resurrection and our new life in him.

On August 16th we celebrate the Feast of St. Mary the Virgin, informally known as the Assumption. Since our Church is honored with the name of St. Mary, we take the opportunity of this special day to give thanks for Our Lady’s life, witness and intercession.
