### America's Prophet: How the Story of Moses Shaped America, Bruce Feiler, 2009

Traveling through touchstones in American history, the author traces the biblical prophet's influence from the Mayflower through today. Meticulously researched and highly readable, this original work of history will change how we view American, our faith, and our future.

Into the Silent Land: A Guide to the Christian Practice of Contemplation, Martin Laird, 2006 Described as a beautiful and consoling book and a reminder that prayer is both real and fundamentally simple, Martin Laird's guide to contemplation describes the Christian tradition's teachings on using a prayer word to focus the mind, working with the breath to cultivate stillness, and the practice of inner vigilance or awareness.

Living into God's Dream: Dismantling Racism in America, Catherine Meeks, ed., 2016

Combining personal stories and theoretical and theological reflection with examples of the work of dismantling racism and methods for creating the "safe space" for dialogue to occur, the authors of this book address such issues as reasons for the failure of past effort and the necessity to honor rage and grief in the process of moving to forgiveness and racial healing.

#### Chanting the Psalms, Cynthia Bourgeault, 2006 (book and CD)

Author Cynthia Bourgeault brings the practice of psalmody into the twenty-first century, providing a history of Christian Psalmody as well as an appreciation of its place in contemplative practice today. Basic techniques and easy melodies that anyone can learn are demonstrated on the accompanying CD where you can chant along with the author.
